They also appreciated a member of the Fort York Guard, in period dress, touring them through the fort. Both visits offered ample opportunities for photographs.

This proposal was approved by the International Executive Board at its 64th World Congress Meeting in Croatia. In these contexts, the IPA Hosting Book makes travel and hosting easy for our members and is a ready - reckoner search tool for information.

This HSM meeting brought-forth desired results and produced valuable benefits to further enhance strategies for developments in this area of operation. All participants, both attended in person and those who joined on-line contributed well with productive output for further development needed. The physical participants were from Germany, Denmark and Sri Lanka and others joined on-line.

IPA JAPAN—AIKIDO DEMONSTRATION IN BARCELONA



I am currently on secondment from the Tokyo Metropolitan Police Department to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, working at the Consulate General of Japan in Barcelona. This summer I was informed about the IPA and joined its Japan Section. I would like to inform you about the Aikido demonstration I gave on December 10th at "Manga Barcelona 2022." A major event to introduce Japanese culture held here, with the cooperation of "Aikido Makoto," which is led by local martial artist Mr. Joaquim Suárez.

Aikido is one of the Japanese martial arts along with Judo, Kendo, and Karate. The main characteristic that distinguishes Aikido from other martial arts is that it is a self-defence art that uses the strength of the opponent rather than one's own, and the physical size difference between the two is not an issue. For this reason, Aikido is particularly suitable for training those that are physically weaker, such as the elderly, and many women opt to participate in this art. Many female police officers in Japan practice it.

After being restricted for more than two years due to the Covid pandemic, the major event to introduce Japanese culture returned to Barcelona in much the same style as before the pandemic, attracting 163,000 visitors over four days. Visitors enjoyed Japanese traditions

and subcultures such as anime, food, art, and even a martial arts experience. I felt the camaraderie of police officers across national borders as I performed the Aikido demonstration in front of the audience of Japanese culture lovers, together with Spanish police officers from "Aikido Makoto".
